DELHI, NY, October 13, 2015:

The Delaware County Broadband Initiative (DCBI) project team will be attending the October Town Board Meeting in the Township of Kortright to answer resident’s questions and concerns about the project. Kortright Town Board Meeting is scheduled for October 19, 2015 at 7:30 p.m. at Kortright Town Hall located at 51702 NY – 10, Bloomville, NY.

As part of Governor Cuomo’s action to expand broadband to upstate New York, 2.9 million was awarded to The Delaware County Broadband Initiative (DCBI) in 2014. Total project is estimated at over \$6,700,000 including \$3.7 million in private investment, \$2.9 million in NYS grant funding, \$25,000 from the Catskill Watershed Corporation, and funding from the Town of Hardenburgh Rising Community Program. This funding will expand broadband in rural areas and open the doors to more economic opportunities, healthcare innovation, and educational investments. The fiber optic network will offer a suite of advanced telecommunications services including voice, video, and broadband. In addition, the network will have the capacity to meet future cell tower connectivity needs, provide business-class Ethernet circuits, and support the Delaware County Emergency Services communications network.

This project has been a joint collaboration between Margaretville Telephone Company (MTC), Delhi Telephone Company (DTC) and Delaware County Electric Cooperative (DCEC). DCBI will extend broadband service to approximately 1,800 un-served and underserved DCEC members and their neighbors located in the Townships of Andes, Colchester, Hamden, Hardenburgh, Harpersfield, Jefferson, Kortright, and Meredith. The extension will be approximately 210 miles of fiber optic line. The construction will take place once contracts are signed by New York State Empire State Development Agency. The estimated timeline of this project is about two years. Broadband services will become available as network segments are activated throughout the construction time-frame. Efforts by the partner companies to secure additional funding will continue to address un-served and underserved residents who are not included within this project area.
