### From the desk of CEO John Gasstrom

Happy Summer, everyone! I think we just experienced our first weekend without rain in such a long time, I can't even remember the last one. I hope everyone has been enjoying their somewhat soggy summer so far, as we at the Coop look forward to continuing some big projects. We are excited to have recently received our new transformers for the Delhi substation, which improve our capacity from 5 MVA to 12 MVA out of that station. See announcement below for more information about two planned outages later in July as we put these two new transformers into service.

As we get closer to August, we are getting geared up for the 81st Annual Meeting of Members, August 23<sup>rd</sup> at 9AM at Delaware Academy. Please include your full name as listed on your account, member number, and service address when registering. As our membership continues to evolve and advance, so too has the Annual Meeting. Also, we have a Member Advocacy Committee meeting scheduled for the end of July at the Coop office. We are excited to announce that this year, we are giving all three charities \$1,000 each (previously we gave \$1,000, \$600, and \$400). ### From the Chief Operating Officer

Hello! My name is Nick Frandsen and I'm thrilled to announce that I've moved into the COO role here at DCEC. I have been DCEC's general counsel for the last two years, and you may recognize my name as an attorney based out of Delhi. I'm looking forward to being part of an already stellar team here, and you can expect to see my name on more communications as time goes on. As I settle into the full-time position, feel free to drop me a line or just say hello. More updates will be forthcoming, but for now the most important is below.

#### **Delhi Substation Upgrade and Planned Outages**

In response to increased demand and anticipated growth, we are upgrading the Delhi substation with two new 12MVA transformers - more than doubling our 5MVA capacity. Our line crew safely received and prepared the transformers for installation, and absent any severe weather, the transformers will be swapped out late this month. If you are a Member in West Delhi, Fraser, Delancey, Fish Hollow, Meredith, or Andes, you will have received notification in your June bill. Please plan for two outages of 1-4 hours each, starting the following times:

1. Friday, July 25th 1pm

2. Tuesday, July 29th 1pm

## 2025 Official Candidates & Voting Details

During this year's meeting, members will elect **one member of the Board of Directors.** This year, there are two ways to vote: In-Person at the Cooperative office, or by mail using an absentee ballot. All votes are due by August 19th and the ballot results will be announced at the annual meeting. Each membership shall be entitled to cast only one ballot; for example, a joint membership has one vote. All questions shall be decided by a vote of a majority of the members voting thereon in person or by absentee ballot. Questions resulting in a tie vote shall be decided by a second round of voting in like manner. If a second round of voting results in a tie, the question shall be decided by a flipping of a coin, which shall be administered by a duly elected officer of the Cooperative. In person, or by absentee ballot, eligible voters can vote for one (1) candidate. Members can vote for a candidate of any of Region, even if they do not reside in that Region. For example, if you live in Walton you are considered to be in the Southern Region, you may vote for a candidate in the Central Region.

## 2025 Candidate for Central Region

In accordance with DCEC by-laws, a Nominating Committee of members has officially identified the following candidate for the office of director of the Cooperative: Edward Furgol.

Thank you to, Seth Blocker, Molly Oliver, Eddie Pick, Lindsey Gardepe, and Randy Tweedie for participating in this year's nominating committee!

Edward Furgol has developed a strong appreciation for the value of public utilities. Born in Utica, NY, his family has lived in upstate New York since 1748. Ed's work as Managing Director of the National Museum of the United States Navy gave him experience in workplace safety, budget processes, ethics, anti-discrimination, personnel management, and public service. Beginning in 2006, he spent part of each year in Delhi, retiring here just over a decade later. By teaching and researching online, Ed has a personal interest in the reliable delivery of electricity and understands the challenges that arise in ensuring that. He has completed his Certified Credentialed Director training. Since September 2023 he has served as treasurer of the board. He always looks for ways to make electricity more affordable to the members.





## Official Absentee Ballot Request Form

**VOTE BY MAIL:** One method for a member to vote is by requesting a mail-in ballot, also known as an absentee ballot. Request an absentee ballot by completing the official form below and submit to DCEC by **August 3, 2025**. Once the Cooperative receives your form, we will provide you with an official absentee ballot which you can then complete and send back to the DCEC office. DCEC will count properly completed absentee ballots as long as they are received by **August 19, 2025** (four business days prior to the Annual Meeting). Once DCEC has received a member's absentee ballot, it cannot be revoked. A member voting by absentee ballot may still attend the Annual Meeting, however, can not vote again.

<u>IN-PERSON VOTING AT THE COOPERATIVE OFFICE:</u> Members can also complete their ballot in person at the Co-op office during regular lobby hours between **July 28 and August 19, 2025**. You must have a government issued photo ID with you to vote in the Cooperative office.

### Helpful Tips:

- Meters Can't get to your meter? Maybe we can't either! Know where your meter is located, keep it clear and accessible. If you're the first person calling in to report an outage, we may ask you to verify your meter is blank. This information allows us to more quickly diagnose the size of the outage and restore power.
- Phone Numbers Make sure your contact information is up to date. There are times we need to contact you confirming your power is restored, billing purposes, and alerts are a few reasons.
- Security Cameras If you call to report an outage because your cameras are not working we will need someone to check that the meter is blank. Cameras can be out due to other factors than power outages

### DCEC Recipe Corner:

### **Slow Cooker Chicken Tacos**

### **Ingredients**

- 1 (15-ounce) can tomato sauce
- 2 Tbsp. chili powder
- 1 Tbsp. cumin
- 1 Tbsp. kosher salt
- 2 tsp. paprika
- 1 tsp. black pepper
- 3 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 6 large boneless, skinless chicken breasts (about 4 ½ pounds)
- Flour tortillas, shredded iceberg lettuce, chopped tomato, shredded cheddar cheese, sour cream, salsa, for serving



#### **Directions**

- In a 6- to 8-quart slow cooker, stir together the tomato sauce, chili powder, cumin, salt, paprika, pepper, garlic, and onion until well combined. Add the chicken, stirring to ensure it is fully coated with the sauce.
- Cover and cook until the chicken is cooked through and the internal temperature of the chicken is 165°F, on low for 4 to 6 hours or on high for 2 to 3 hours.
- Remove the chicken to a large cutting board. When it is cool enough to handle, cut it into bite-sized pieces. Return the chicken to the sauce and stir very well.
- IV. Cover and cook on low for 15 minutes more.
- Serve on tortillas topped with lettuce, tomatoes, cheese, sour cream, and salsa.
