### From the desk of CEO John Gasstrom

Welcome summer. We are happy to put our wet, rainy spring behind us, and we hope that you have had some good weather for enjoying outdoor events. We are taking advantage of the longer days, and crews have been working to keep the Rights of Way trimmed, continuing to take down dead, dying ash trees that have succumbed to the Emerald Ash Borer. We are also excited to receive our new substation transformers to upgrade the capacity of our Delhi Substation (see picture below, right). The installation of these transformers will require two short outages for the entire substation. These outages are scheduled for July 25<sup>th</sup> and July 29<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon on each day. If you are served by the Delhi Substation and will be affected by these outages, you will have received an additional notice in this mailing, providing additional details. You can always call our office with any questions.

We are very proud of this year's scholarship winner and youth delegate to our Legislative Conference, Niko Krzyston. Niko joined Director Jeff Russell and myself in Washington D.C. in late April as we visited several members of Congress on Capitol Hill to advocate for important cooperative issues. We especially appreciate Congressman Josh Riley for spending some time with us to listen to our issues, and following up with us by meeting again back here in New York.

This year, we held our first Member Q&A session on March 31<sup>st</sup> in Delhi. We have upcoming sessions in the Southern Region (Location and date tbd) and August 18 at 5:30 PM (virtual). We also appreciate those that stopped to chat with us at the Meredith Dairy Fest. DCEC will once again host a tent at the DTC Open House on August 6<sup>th</sup> in Delhi. Stayed tuned for announcements about more sessions to come in the fourth quarter of the year!

### Níko Krzyston selected as DCEC's 2025 Student Delegate

DCEC's student delegate 2025, Niko Krzyston of Delhi, represented the Cooperative at the recent National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) legislative Conference in Washington, D.C.

Each year, 11th graders of DCEC community schools are given the opportunity to apply and be considered to represent the Cooperative at this national event. Students are selected based on their academic achievement, involvement in extra-curricular activities, letters of recommendation, and service to the community. As a Student Youth Delegate, Niko accompanied DCEC officials to Washington. Niko, along with Student Delegates from two NY Cooperatives, Oneida Madison's delegate Thatcher Bugbee, and Otsego's delegate Elias MacLeish, joined representatives from 900 other rural electric co-ops in meetings with Congressional leaders on Capitol Hill.

Life-long friendships, enhanced leadership skills, and a broader understanding of electric cooperatives and the energy industry are among some take aways from past attendees. DCEC is delighted to have Niko as 2025's Delaware County Electric Cooperative Student Delegate.

A word from Kyla Lawrence, Operations and Member Engagement Coordinator, of Onieda-Madison Electric Cooperative:

Niko's enthusiasm, curiosity, and warmth made him effortlessly engaging—not just for me, but for the other two students as well. Though I've visited D.C. many times, experiencing the city through the perspective of a first-timer never fails to offer a fresh lens. What stood out most was how Niko gravitated toward the small, often-overlooked details—those quiet elements that shape the character of the nation's capitol in ways many miss. I appreciated his insights and humor, but more than anything, I valued the camaraderie that quickly formed among the students in just a few short days.

## 2025 Official Candidates & Voting Details

During this year's meeting, members will elect **one member of the Board of Directors.** This year, there are two ways to vote-In-Person at the Cooperative office, or by mail using an absentee ballot. All votes are due by August 19th and the ballot results will be announced at the annual meeting. Each membership shall be entitled to cast only one ballot; for example, a joint membership has one vote. All questions shall be decided by a vote of a majority of the members voting thereon in person or by absentee ballot. Questions resulting in a tie vote shall be decided by a second round of voting in like manner. If a second round of voting results in a tie, the question shall be decided by a flipping of a coin, which shall be administered by a duly elected officer of the Cooperative. In person, or by absentee ballot, eligible voters can vote for one (1) candidate. Members can vote for a candidate of any of Region, even if they do not reside in that Region. For example, if you live in Walton you are considered to be in the Southern Region, you may vote for a candidate in the Central Region.

### Official Absentee Ballot Request Form

<u>VOTE BY MAIL:</u> One method for a member to vote is by requesting a mail-in ballot, also known as an absentee ballot. Request an absentee ballot by completing the official form below and submit to DCEC by **August 3, 2025**. Once the Cooperative receives your form, we will provide you with an official absentee ballot which you can then complete and send back to the DCEC office. DCEC will count properly completed absentee ballots as long as they are received by **August 19, 2025** (four business days prior to the Annual Meeting). Once DCEC has received a member's absentee ballot, it cannot be revoked. A member voting by absentee ballot may still attend the Annual Meeting, however, can not vote again.

<u>IN-PERSON VOTING AT THE COOPERATIVE OFFICE:</u> Members can also complete their ballot in person at the Co-op office during regular lobby hours between **July 28 and August 19, 2025**. You must have a government issued photo ID with you to vote in the Cooperative office.



### DCEC Recipe Corner:

#### Summer Lavender Lemonade

EatingWell.com, April 2025

#### Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup granulated sugar 0
- 0 4 cups water
- 2 tablespoons dried lavender, plus more for garnish 0
- 2 cups fresh lemon juice (~12 large lemons) 0
- o 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 0 Ice

Run washers and dryers early in

the morning or late in the evening.

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Combine ½ cup sugar and 1 cup water in a small saucepan over medium heat. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the sugar dissolves, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat and stir in 2 tablespoons lavender. Let stand until the flavors meld and the mixture cools, about 30 minutes. Strain the mixture through a fine-mesh sieve into a large pitcher; discard the lavender.
- Add 2 cups lemon juice, ¼ teaspoon salt and the remaining 3 cups water; stir well to combine.
- Divide the lemonade among 8 ice-filled glasses. Garnish with additional lavender, if desired.
